

Guidelines for Activities to Prevent the Spread of COVID-19 (BCP: Business Continuity Plan)

**In cases of changing to online classes

1) Only a class in which an infected person occurs

If at least one infected person (student or faculty member) in a hybrid or face-to-face class attended a face-to-face class, it would be changed to an online class.

2) All classes

If more than one infected person (student or faculty member) attending a face-to-face class were found to have attended multiple classes or been active in various organizations or locations, all classes would be changed to online classes.

<Restriction levels and the countermeasures>

1) Restriction levels shall be judged by considering the status of spread or the control of infection nationwide and in the Tokyo metropolitan area comprehensively, as well as the level of requests issued by the government and other authorities.

2) Judgments on the restriction level shall be made by the University with reference to the above guidelines. The specific countermeasures to further activities, as well as measures for items not listed in the above, shall be deliberated and determined by the related organizations, depending on the content.

Please note that the above restriction levels and measures are provided as guidelines only.

Measures that are not stated above may be taken after comprehensively considering the situation.

3) When an infected person occurs on campus, regardless of these Guidelines for Activities, the entrance prohibition to campus may be temporarily implemented based on a request from the healthcare authority of the Tokyo Government (public health center etc.).
